The [Catalyst Network Foundation Inc. \(CNF\)](#) is a non-profit education initiative [501\(c\)\(3\) organization](#) based in New York City and Washington, D.C.

Founded in 2011, [CNF](#) is focused on life enrichment and professional development, with a mission to engage high-potential [youth](#) (ages 14-25) and veterans (ages 21-30) with successful projects by providing the proper tools, network, and development opportunities.
